Please describe your main achievements in this role in the last period

- In April 24, successfully standing for election for second three-year term on CINGO Standing Committee ensuring a social work voice at heart of CINGO. This involves being part of a close working committee team, coordinating CINGO and working closely with the CINGO President
- Contribution on behalf of CINGO to drafting new Council of Europe recommendations on children's rights in parental separation and care proceedings
- Writing successful application for new 3 year mandate for CINGO Children's Rights committee and building the membership and workplan.
- Supporting and designing children's rights webinars as part of CINGO committee.
- Leading on the writing of three-year (24-27) strategy for CINGO through member survey and webinar consultation, promoting focus of CINGO on



social rights, intersectional equalities perspective, rights of marginalised and most disadvantaged citizens, youth empowerment and involvement, environment and eco-social perspectives and taking action to protect NGO freedoms and defenders of human rights

- Linking work of Turkish Association in the earthquake zones with that of a fellow CINGO committee member from Turkey involved in parallel work supporting children. We are planning a CINGO human rights and democracy visit to NGOs and social workers in Turkey in 2024.
- enabling youth representation from IFSW in the General Assembly and World Forum for Democracy

If you wish to continue in your role, please list your key objectives/aims for the next year.

I will continue in my elected role in the Standing Committee until April 2027. My attendance is resourced by CINGO.

However, IFSW Europe should appoint at least one new representative to CINGO and should also appoint a support team if possible to provide more capacity for social work representation. In person attendance in Strasbourg is very beneficial to have an impact on CINGO's work and its influence in Council of Europe although remote joining is possible. Consistent attendance is required at the twice yearly, three-day General Assemblies is the minimum commitment.

I would recommend one or more members of the New Social Workers' Project are involved as representative or in the Support Group. They could then be involved in developing youth-focused activities.
