

**Colleen Lundy MSW, PhD** is a social work Professor Emeritus at Carleton University, Ottawa Canada. She has taught and published on social work and human rights and its engagement with the welfare state. Her book *Social Work, Social Justice and Human Rights: A Structural Approach to Practice* (Toronto: University of Toronto Press, 2011) offers a critical analysis of the social, economic and political context of social work with a clear application to practice. She co-authored *One Hundred Years of Social Work: A History of the Profession in English Canada 1900-2000* (Waterloo: Wilfrid Laurier Press, 2011), the first complete history of social work in Canada. She has been involved in several international research initiatives that examine social policy and human rights and assist in the development of a social welfare state. For four years she was the Academic Director of the Centre for International Migration and Settlement Studies at Carleton.
