Maggie Carter will review key findings from the "Crises of Inequality: Shifting Power for a New Eco-Social Contract," and highlight sustainable development approach based on alternative economies, strengthening solidarities, and a vision for transformation change: a new eco-social contract for people and planet.

Families that have access to social supports are far less likely to resort to child labor. Deputy Undersecretary Thea Lee will share learning from the Bureau of International Labor Affairs' work to counter child labor and trafficking by linking vulnerable families with social protections, and will discuss how this work advances SDGs.

Gita Jaffe, Senior Policy/Global Affairs Advisor Global Alliance for Behavioral Health Social Justice

Gita Jaffe will share findings from efforts in fostering social connection, reconceptualizing the mental health workforce, primary prevention of child trafficking, advocating for the inclusion of mental health in UHC and emergency preparedness, and address centering mental health and human rights in society as critical to achieving the SDGs.
