Rights, Voice, Protections: Co-Creating Social Justice in an Eco-Social World

CONCEPT NOTE

The International Federation of Social Workers side panel event will focus on the overarching goal of eradicating poverty through the realization of the right to development within planetary boundaries.

The People's Charter calls for co-creating social justice includes access to social protections that ensure that workers are included in participatory processes. This work is done through building on organic community systems that provide support for generations.
