## Message of Seyed Hassan Mousavi Chelak, President of the Iran Association of Social Workers and IFSW-AP Ethic commissioner, for the World Social Work Day

The notion of intergenerational relationships has received attention across various disciplines, particularly in social sciences and social work. The presence of conflicting values among different generations has been identified as a contributing factor to this disparity. As a result, the emergence of tensions and problems between these generations is likely, with the potential for negative impacts on their quality of life.

In response to these challenges, individuals often seek assistance from social organizations, whether governmental or non-governmental, to address their needs and improve their quality of life. Among these specialists, social workers are frequently sought for assistance in navigating challenges and addressing crises, as well as for their role in preventing social harms. It is imperative for social workers to be cognizant of and adept in managing social transformations that are an inevitable consequence of societal evolution. By doing so, they can facilitate individuals in achieving self-empowerment through their own active engagement and the utilization of their individual, familial, and social resources and capabilities.
