Anne C. Deepak, Ph.D., MSSW is an Associate Professor and Interim Director of the DSW in Human Rights Leadership at Monmouth University School of Social Work. Dr. Deepak's scholarly work has been focused on developing and applying a postcolonial feminist social work perspective to issues such as food security, human trafficking, humanitarian initiatives for women's economic empowerment, social work practice with refugees and immigrants, and sustainability and population growth.
