As President of the College of Social Work Professionals of Puerto Rico, he has led the College, to be the organization with the largest presence in the discussion of social issues in the media in the country.

Mr. Alicea has Bachelor (1997) and Master of Social Work (1999) from the University of Puerto Rico. He also has the degree of Juris Doctor (2006) from the Faculty of Law at the Interamerican University of Puerto Rico.
