During tenure as National President I have:

- Co-led the hosting of the 2009 Asia Pacific Regional conference in Auckland, New Zealand, in partnership with Social Work Educators.
- Led the revisions of Code of Ethics and professional processes completed ensuring they remain congruous with IFSW documents. International policies adopted as appropriate within ANZASW. International Definition of social work informs professional and regulatory body documents.

- Supported regional activities to promote membership across region although vast geographic region problematic in this. Working to support Fiji to maintain membership and expand involvement within the region.
- Encouraged debate within ANZASW of policies during consultation processes. ANZASW assisted in the development of the inaugural IFSW indigenous policy.
- Participated in regional and general meetings during tenure or delegation as president and participation in these forums, congruous with the Constitution and by- laws of IFSW.
- Since the completion of tenure as National President have been supported by ANZASW to maintain role as voluntary secretary of Asia Pacific region and whenever possible have attended regional meetings.
